



See how long it takes to get around Rhode Island on transit versus a car. **Who will win?**












Central Falls, Rhode Island has one of the highest transit propensities in the state of Rhode Island.

This isochrone is how far you can get in the Providence Metro area by taking transit for 30 mins in any direction.










Johnston, Rhode Island borders Providence to the West, and is a suburban town close to the highway with one bus route.



The city boundaries are overlaid by the areas of San Francisco, Boston, and Manhattan. All of which have their own mobility issues.





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


The APTA states that the average household saves \$10,000 yearly by owning one less car and taking public transit instead. or \$833 per month.

Congestion

LA Metro 35 day strike was studied....

- 47% reduction in freeway congestion due to transit
- 3.02 billion in annual savings (2021 dollars) for LA freeway commuters due to transit





Economic Output

From 2016 to 2018....

- 81 developments completed w/.25 miles of DART Stations
- 5.138 billion dollars = Total property of development
- \$286.4 million in state/local tax revenue
- 10.27 billion for the Dallas Fort Worth economy





Emissions by Mode of Transport




Future of Rail

Reinvesting in Amtrak with City Pairs

Amtrak's connect us plan released in 2021 focuses on city pair corridors that either better existing routes or create new ones.

Cities that are too short to fly, or too long to drive, are the next frontier in how transit reduces our carbon emissions.

Asking others for rides


- Transit has been and can be the ability to be a powerful mobility generator for those who have mobility impairments

Using special transportation services


Using public transit less often

- Transit has power to equalize mobility for those who are physically impaired to those who are able bodied.






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
Mobility Impaired Riders




The Power of Transit | To Connect Us



In its Basic Utility...

Jan Gehl, famous Copenhagen architect says that transit, unlike the street which is often sized for cars, is "inherently human scale."
